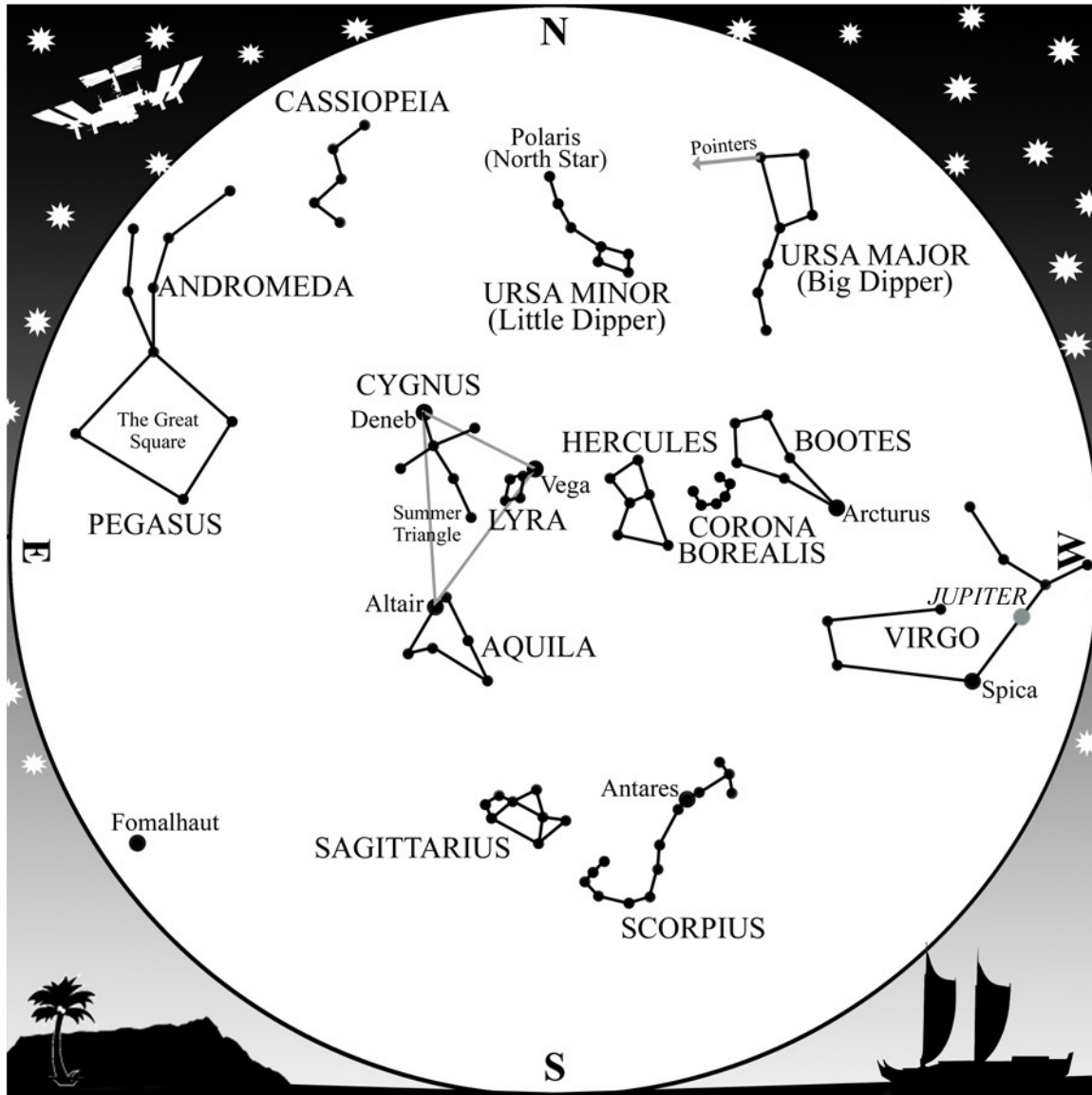

How To Use This Map...

Hold this map over your head so that the northern horizon points toward the northern horizon on the Earth. For best results use a red flashlight to illuminate the map.

Use this map about 10:00 p.m. early in the month, 9:00 p.m. mid-month, and 8:00 p.m. late in the month.

* Planets pictured represent positions as viewed on the 15th of the month.

Selected Hawaiian Star Names:

- Altair - Humu - No translation available.
- Antares - Lehua-Kona - "Southern Lehua Blossom"
- Arcturus - Hokule'a - "Star of Happiness".
- Cassiopeia - Lehua Kona - "Southern Lehua Blossom".
- Lyra - Keoe - No Translation Available.
- Polaris - Hokupa'a - "The Stationary Star".
- Scorpius - Ka Makau Nui O Maui - "The Big Fishhook of Maui".
- Ursa Major - Na Hiku - "The Seven".
