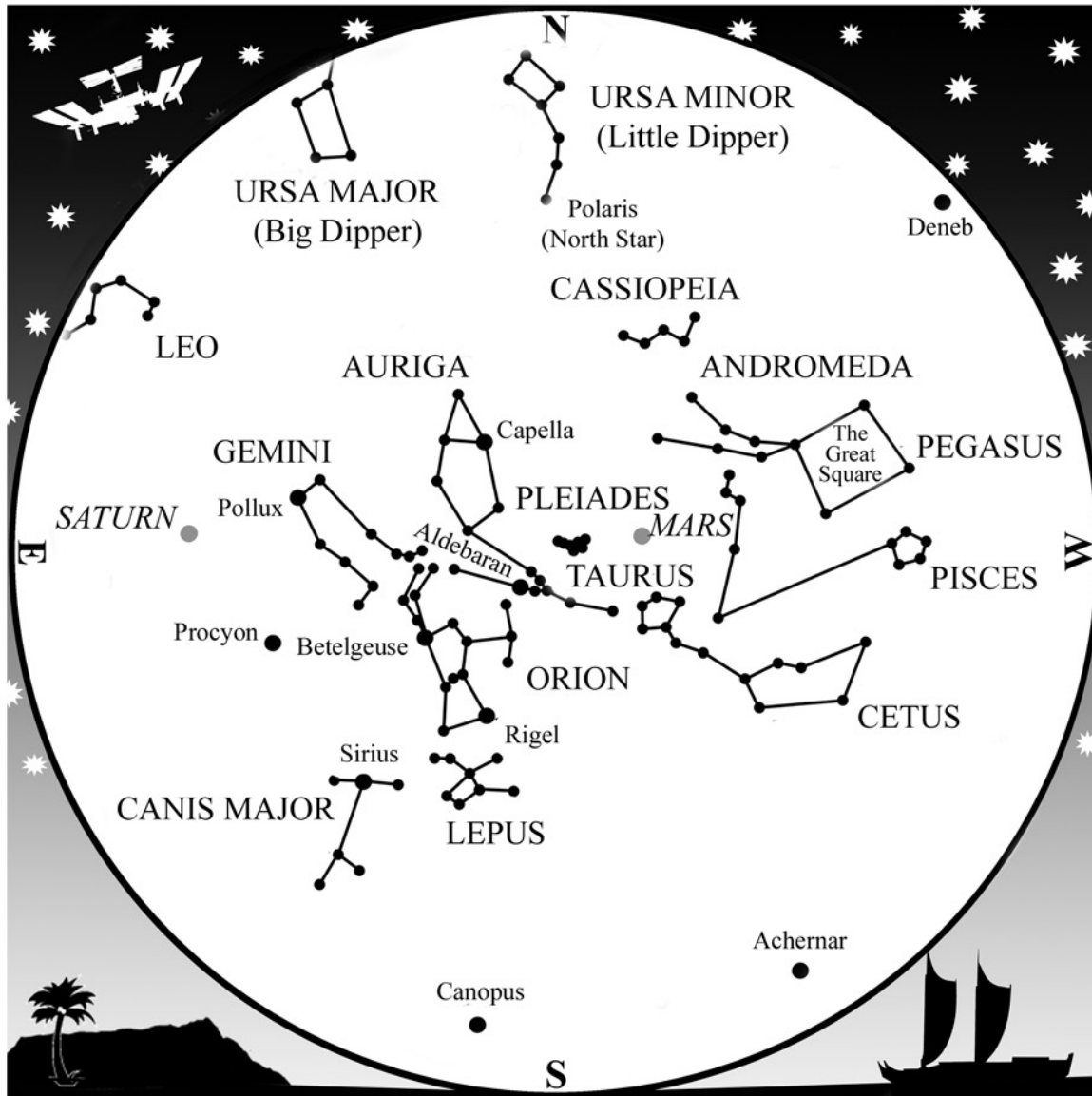

How To Use This Map...

Hold this map over your head so that the northern horizon points toward the northern horizon on the Earth. For best results, use a red flashlight to illuminate the map.

Use this map at about 9:00 p.m. early in the month, 8:00 p.m. mid-month, and 7:00 p.m. late in the month.

*NOTE: Planets pictured represent positions as viewed on January 15, 2006

Selected Hawaiian Star Names:

- Aldebaran - Hoku`ula - "Red Star".
- Auriga - Hoku-lei - "The Star Wreath"
- Betelgeuse - Kaulua-koko - "Brilliant Red Star".
- Cassiopeia - `Iwa Keli`i - "The Frigate Bird".
- Orion - Ka Hei-hei o na Keiki - "The Cat's Cradle of the Children"
- Pleiades - Makali`i - "Little Eyes".
- Polaris - Hokupa'a - "The Stationary Star"
- Procyon - Puana - "Blossom"
- Sirius - A'a - "Fire"
