Digitization Volunteer Opportunities Available in Entomology



Help unlock valuable information about the diversity and distribution of parasitic arthropods in the Bishop Museum Entomology Collection by becoming part of the multi-institutional project - Terrestrial Parasite Tracker. We are accepting volunteer Digitization interns to help make these data available to scientists across a variety of disciplines. Interns will help with imaging, databasing, and georeferencing specimen data in our collections. This work will allow us to synthesize thousands of important Hawaiian arthropod records so that the specimens, and their associated data, will be available to help understand and predict the spread of human and wildlife disease. Interns will gain experience in using digital imaging systems, macro photography, photogrammetry, image editing tools, collection management software, arthropod taxonomy, and geography. Good computer skills using Windows 10 is required.
